

CHAPTER FINANCIALS

In Fiscal Year 2025, AGA Atlanta maintained a strong financial position while strategically investing in initiatives that enhance member value and engagement. As of June 30, 2025, the Chapter's cash balance was \$19,993.82, reflecting continued financial stability and thoughtful management of resources.

To further promote financial transparency and accountability, a financial consultant is conducting a comprehensive review of the Chapter's Fiscal Year 2025 finances, with results to be published on our website in January 2025.

REVENUES:

This year, we saw a **17% increase** in revenues. Revenues from educational events doubled this year, thanks to increased non-member participation, while we kept attendance costs the same. This growth shows the Chapter's expanding reach and commitment to accessible professional development.

EXPENSES:

This year, we saw a **14% increase** in expenses. Program expenses rose this year as we Increased the number of paid speakers which enhanced the value of our educational events. Additionally, the Chapter covered membership dues for Executive Committee members to encourage greater participation in leadership roles.

LOOKING FORWARD

As we enter Fiscal Year 2026, the AGA Atlanta Chapter remains focused on strengthening connections, enhancing education, and ensuring long-term financial stability. We are confident our commitment to adaptability, collaboration, and service will continue to guide us in delivering meaningful value to the community we serve.

OVERCOMING & ADVANCING:

- Rising to lead: AGA Atlanta has been fortunate to have strong leaders, but recruiting new leaders was challenging. To encourage participation and show appreciation, the Chapter began covering dues for Executive Committee members, supporting their efforts and thanking them for their commitment to our Chapter. This simple shift allowed us to welcome four new perspectives to our Executive Committee for Fiscal Year 2026.
- Strengthening our community: Member retention and community engagement remains
 a key priority, especially among federal employees where we saw a sharp renewal
 decline but increase in participation. To address this, we are expanding our reach to new
 agencies, reengaging with lapsed members, and expanding opportunities for
 engagement to ensure our community sees the value of AGA membership.

BUILDING ON SUCCESS:

- Accessible education: We are restructuring our educational opportunities to ensure
 accessibility and continued value by reducing the cost of attendance and increasing
 webinar and in-person offerings in the second half of Fiscal Year 2026. Our topics will be
 broadened to address emerging trends, incorporate more soft-skills, and provide more
 hands-on learning experiences for attendees.
- Funding our future: With a change in revenue structure, the Chapter is pursuing new sponsorships and partnerships to sustain programming and keep costs low. Additionally, these partnerships will allow us to expand our current scholarship offerings and to invest in new opportunities that strengthen and support our professional community and students.
